Barts Explanatory Model Interview

A One day workshop for health and social care practitioners and researchers

Time: 10.00am – 4.00pm

Venue: Centre for Psychiatry, Queen Mary University of London, Charterhouse Square, London, EC1M 6BQ

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This one-day workshop is designed for health and social care practitioners and for researchers wishing to learn to use the Barts Explanatory Model Interview, and to learn in general about explanatory model assessment and implications in mental health care. The assessment of explanatory models is essential for patient centred, recovery orientated, and value based care that ensures the patient is understood and can participate fully in their care. This is especially important in a culturally diverse society where illness and values can differ markedly, and can influence engagement and recovery. This workshop will help researchers and clinicians about assessing explanatory models in the process of providing high quality clinical care, and in undertaking high quality research. The workshop includes short presentations followed by problem based discussion and role play so that participants can be skilled up to use the Barts Explanatory Model Interview.
